

As we journey further into Term 1 we focus deeper on our Ngā Tikanga. We have now begun unpacking Tiaki Taiao, Respect for the Environment. This is reinforced in the first few weeks in the expectations within the classroomswhere we keep our tools for working, and how we manage the tidiness of these (books, furniture, shoes on racks etc.)

We are now investigating and sustaining the school systems that we have established as a Beyond Green/Gold Enviroschool. Our GoMAD (Go Make a Difference) student enviro team have decided on areas of responsibility and are focused on improving our efforts in the following areas: Nikau/Rata GoMADers- really want us all to be aware of the new plantings in our school and the importance of nurturing these by keeping off the gardens and plantings, so they do grow to improve the quality of the air and support the reduction of our carbon footprint. Kowhai GoMADers- have focussed their energies into tidying up the amount of rubbish in the school grounds (plastics wrappers etc and the avoidance of wrappings going down the drains). These students are working on widespread campaigns into promoting "Nude Food" and "Nude Lunch Boxes" to reduce our environmental impact at school.

The Totara GoMAD team- are working on a multi-aspect approach and are reinvestigating the introduction of walking buses to reduce our carbon footprint, the switching off of power when not in use, improving the functionality of the food scrap, cardboard, paper, glass and plastic recycling systems, and looking into the cleaning products that are being used across the school and determining whether we can do this in "greener" ways.

School Closed Easter Tuesday Explained
